



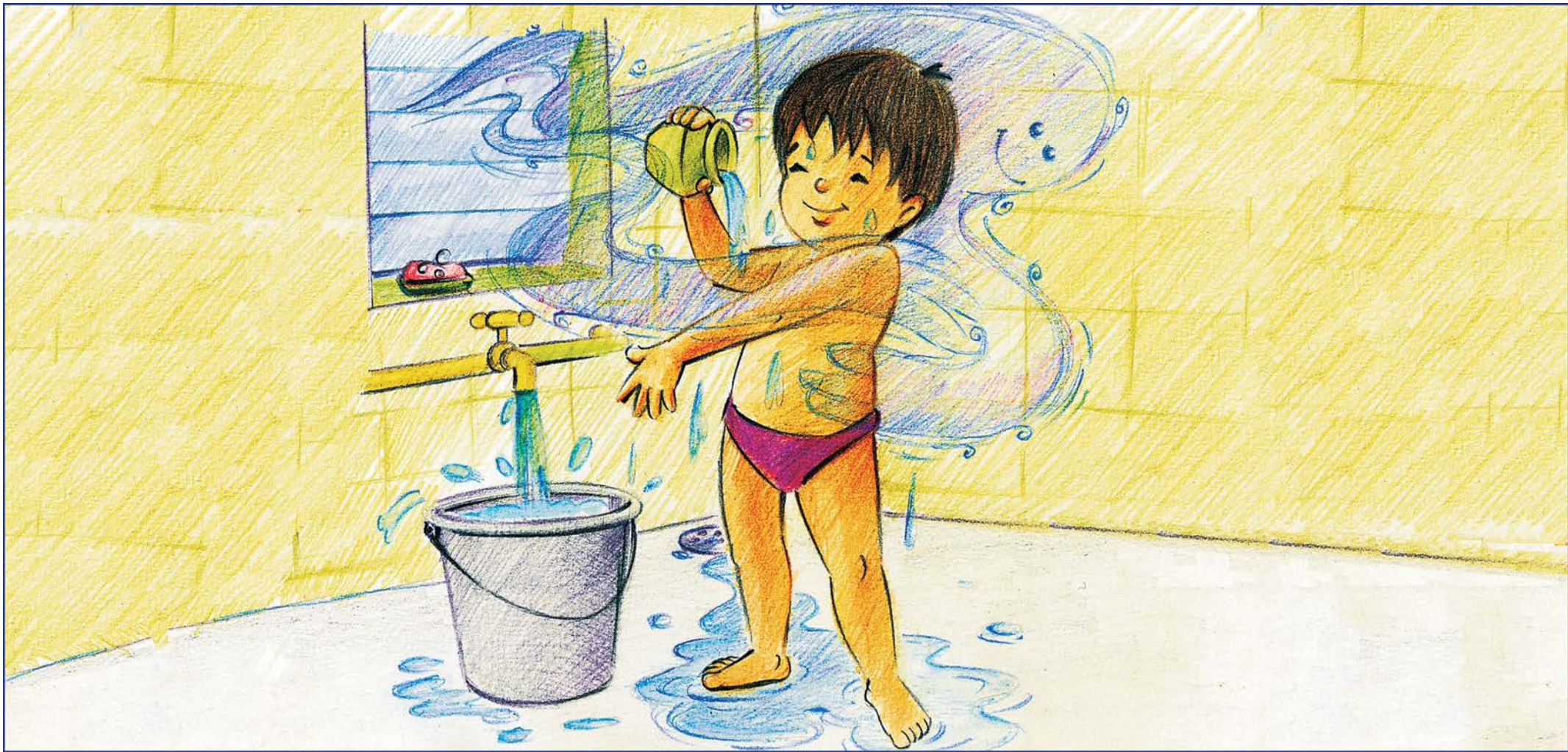

Vayu the Wind!

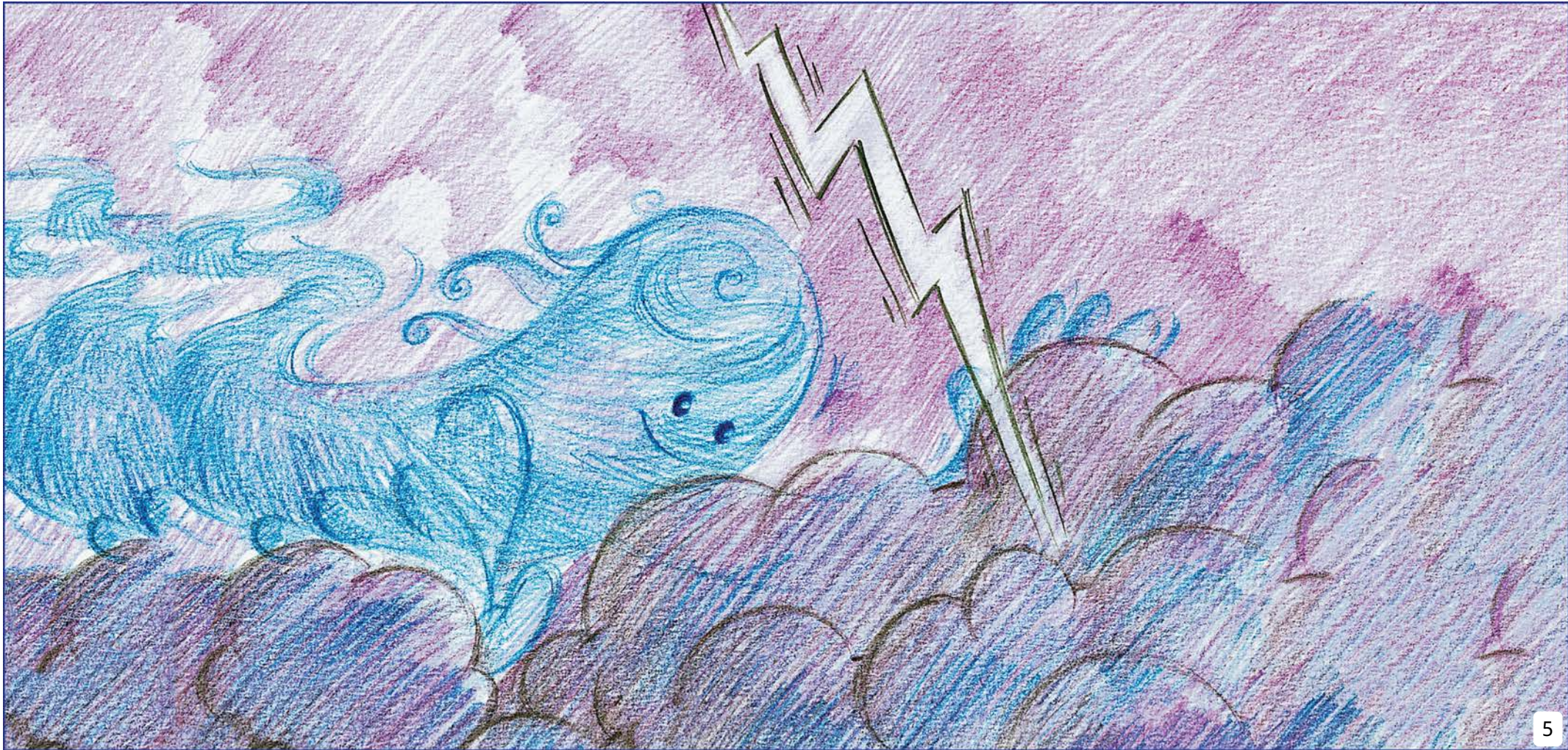
The milk in my cup is too hot, too hot.

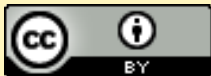

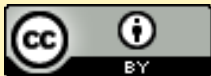
