There is no electricity anyway.



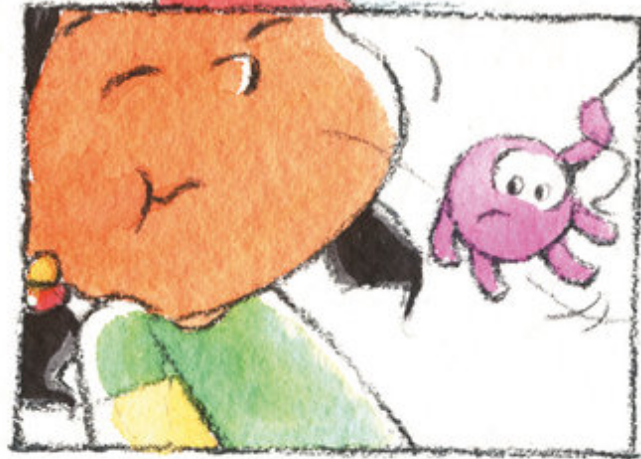
What am I going to do?

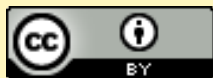
